Cool Fact: James E. Pepper whiskey was the choice of Presidents and statesmen for over 200 years in this country. It was ‘Born with the Revolution’.

The Pepper family brand of whiskey is an iconic Kentucky whiskey brand initially produced during the American Revolution and continued through 1967. The family built and operated two main distilleries: first founding the site that today hosts the Woodford Reserve Distillery, and later the James E. Pepper Distillery in Lexington. In the late 1960s the bourbon industry hit hard times, and both the brand and distillery in Lexington were abandoned for over half a century. In 2008 the brand was relaunched by whiskey entrepreneur Amir Peay. A decade-long campaign of thorough historical research and collection of historic materials was used to retell the lost story of this iconic American whiskey brand and to distill new stocks of "Pepper" whiskey (visit the History Page to learn more). To initiate the relaunch of the brand, partnerships with the Lawrenceburg Distillery in Indiana and the Bardstown Bourbon Co. in Kentucky were formed. Today some of our whiskies contain whiskies distilled at those distilleries. After a multi-year construction effort, the historic James E. Pepper Distillery—which after fifty years of neglect had fallen into a terrible state of disrepair—was completely rebuilt and restored. In December 2017, the distillery once again began distilling whiskey using the same historic recipe as when it shut down in 1967.



‘1776’ Straight Rye

Back in the day, Col. J.E.P. nicknamed his whiskey “Old 1776,” an homage to the Revolutionary-era recipes it followed. James E. Pepper 1776 Straight Rye Whiskey rejuvenates the Colonel’s “Pure Rye” recipe – the precise grain bills for which are laid-out in an historic letter, written by the Colonel and recently discovered during the extensive research that went into the Pepper brand’s relaunch. The Rye has a 90% rye mash bill, is bottled at 100 Proof in dark, vintage-style cork-stopped bottles, and is not chill-filtered. Its deep copper hue exudes leather, oak and caramel, is heady with spice and sweetened with a splash of clover honey. Pepper (appropriately) and clove command a flavor that’s chased by honey-sweetened blackberries. The finish is laced with peppered chocolate shavings long, and quite smooth for 50% ABV. Light citrus lingers with vanilla and mixed berry long after the initial finish fades.

'1776' Straight Bourbon

100 Proof - Not Chill-Filtered - Over 38% Rye in the Mash Bill. Rich Bourbon Sweetness and Rye Spice; vanilla, honey, chocolate and cloves. This Bourbon carries no age statement but has a solid structure to it. Modest wood notes here, with restrained yet polished sweetness. You get less of the typical vanilla notes but more citrus in their stead, a refined and balanced experience that provides a touch of racy red pepper, baking spices, and a little gingerbread on the finish.

Barrel Proof Rye

Like the 100 proof version, 1776 Barrel Proof Rye Whiskey has been matured for 2-3 years in charred new American oak. The mash bill has over 90% rye like the recipe from Colonel James E. Pepper's Revolutionary-era suggests.

Barrel Proof Bourbon

James E Pepper 1776 Barrel Proof Straight Bourbon Whiskey is not Chill-Filtered, and has a mash-bill of over 38% Rye. This is the same exact whiskey as in the standard award winning 100 proof version, only straight from the barrel.

This custom bottle is a re-creation of a decanter from our distillery in the 1940s. We are thrilled and honored to continue the legacy of the Pepper family.

Unique blends of our oldest stocks and distinct mash bills, consisting of Corn, Rye, Malted Barley and Malted Rye; Aged in new toasted and charred barrels made from Kentucky oak, air seasoned a minimum of 18-24 months; Water source from the historic distillery well. Distilled and bottled at the historic James E. Pepper Distillery. Average age of whiskies is 5.5 years; bottled straight from the barrel, uncut and unfiltered. A balanced and complex flavor profile, tasting notes include toasted oak, walnuts, marzipan, dried dark fruits, citrus peel, creamy vanilla and nutmeg.

Old Pepper Single Barrel Rye Barrel Proof

Aged 4 years. Cask 1132. The barrels selected for the Old Pepper label were carefully chosen from JEP's finest stocks and hand bottled at the historic distillery. Some were distilled at the distillery (DSP-KY-5) and others by partner distilleries who initially helped James E. Pepper relaunch the brand through collaborative distilling.
